ARTISTIC INTERVENTIONS

Art Builds (2019-present): Together with Gordon Hoople (Engineering), Nate Parde (Theatre), and Diane Hofoss (Mathematics) I have co-founded an interdisciplinary art collective. We are committed to building public art that sparks joy and invites engagement. My personal intention is to extend the ideas found in my written work out into the world in physical form. Our three most recent pieces play with key concepts from my new book manuscript, Bonded, including liminality, multiple perspectives, structure, and agency. With Gordon Hoople I have written about this experience in Connective Action (2024, Cambridge University Press).

Penumbra (2024, Black Rock City, Nevada, Burning Man) was commissioned through a Black Rock City 2024 Honoraria art grant. By day it invites exploration. Night brings a transformation as an internal tower becomes a beacon, throwing shadows across the desert floor and calling participants to the tower's top. This floating camp fire invites people to commune. And to play, as the light's position is controlled by a wheel.

Unfolding Humanity (2023, Black Rock City, Nevada, Burning Man) was commissioned through a Black Rock City 2023 Honoraria art grant. This steel dodecahedron covered in more than 17,000 LEDs highlights the tension between technology and humanity. The pentagonal walls of the sculpture unfold under human power and allude to Albrecht Dürer's 500-year-old unsolved math problem on unfolding polyhedral and it was conceived, designed, and built by a large (80+) group of faculty, students, and community volunteers.

re:emergence (2022, Black Rock City, Nevada, Burning Man) is a 20' tall and 60' long series of gates designed to spark joy, prompt reflection, and invite action. Dramatically extending design features from Emergence (2021), re:emergence demonstrates the extent to which structures shape, but can never fully constrain, human action. At times the design seems to require some forms of action (stooping at the saddle point, for example), but nothing stops you from exiting the tunnel, and climbing outside of the structure altogether.







Reflexion (2022, La Jolla, California) was commissioned through the City of San Diego's Park Social initiative. With its mirrored columns and individually rotatable prisms, Reflexion is a meditation on the competing, overlapping, distorting, and clarifying roles played by lenses, filters, and frames in contemporary life. Yet, just when all seems lost, Reflexion reminds us of our power – to take control and to change perspectives. Stand between them, and multiple perspectives help us see the impossible, and perhaps notice what we've missed.



Emergence (2021, Mojave Desert, Everywhen) was a 10' tall, 30' long, LED-illuminated wooden sculpture. The piece invites meditation on the liminal – the no-man's zone between moments and eras. Conceptualized in the midst of a global pandemic, and installed as the world was recalibrating the aftermath, Emergence constricts and flares in ways that remind us that we must both bow and climb.



About Time (2019, Black Rock City, Nevada, Burning Man) was a thirty-foot long, 3,000 pound wooden sundial reflected on the role time plays in our lives, as master and measure. This installation projected time using two sundials: a horizontal dial which swept time out across the desert floor and an equatorial dial located on one face of the pyramidal structure. A platform at the peak of the pyramid allowed visitors to become the sundial's apex and to experience panoramic views of the landscape. At the end of the installation the piece was burned, underscoring time's fleeting nature.
